Guidelines for ERA 2017 Bursary Applications

The Emerging Researchers in Ageing (ERA) initiative, Curtin University, and a number of ERA 2017 conference sponsors are pleased to offer a small number of bursaries to assist current students in ageing to attend and present at the ERA 2017 conference. Bursaries of up to \$250 each are open to students who have an abstract accepted for ERA 2017.

Please note the following conditions for application which apply to all bursaries:

Eligibility criteria

- Currently enrolled student conducting research in ageing at a University.
- An abstract to present a paper or poster at the ERA 2017 conference is accepted.
- The research you are undertaking has a focus on ageing and is expected to benefit the field of ageing.
- Bursaries are available to individuals who are either not in receipt of any other financial assistance or as a 'top-up' for those already receiving partial financial assistance to attend the ERA conference.

Application process

- Download the Bursary Application Form via the [ERA 2017](#) webpage.
- The form can be completed electronically and saved with the file name "ERA 2017 Bursary Application Form_SurnameFirstInitial".
- On the form you will be asked to indicate, in no more than 200 words, how attending the ERA conference will assist you to develop your career and enhance your research studies.
- Return the completed form via email to era2017conference@era.edu.au using ERA 2017 Bursary Application - Surname as the subject heading.
- Closing date for applications for the ERA 2017 bursaries is **1 September 2017**.

Notification of the outcome of your application will be emailed to you approximately two weeks after the application deadline.
